On Wednesday September 9, the CCC was invited to a Zoom cast presented by Noah Buchanan from Hunt's Photo. Noah gave a presentation on the current trend of mirrorless cameras. He gave an overall review on the technology and specifications of the many brands of mirrorless cameras. Miguel "Mike" Lopez, a Nikon representative entered the meeting after Noah concluded his presentation. Mike gave a thorough overview of the Nikon mirrorless system. One interesting fact presented was that Nikon began as an optic innovator in 1959 and has sold over 100 million lenses since that time. Nikon has used the same F type lens transition from analog to our current digital times throughout the years, and it is only since the invention of the mirrorless system that Nikon has changed it's format. Being a Nikon user for many years I found it rewarding to see the lens adapter for the the older lenses (manual & digital) to fit on the mirrorless camera with little to no loss of quality. Maybe I'm somewhat biased to Nikon, but I considered this meeting excellent!!!!


