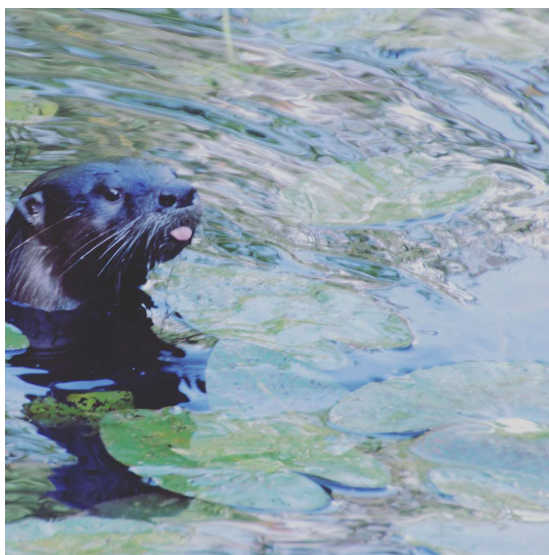
- 1) Some member's slideshows (about 45 minutes)
