Did You Know

Photoshop was developed by brothers Thomas and John Knoll in 1987 when it was used for processing and displaying grayscale images on a monochrome display. It came out in October 1988 as *Image Pro*. Somewhere along the way the name was changed and the first copies of Photoshop were distributed along with hardware sold by scanner maker Barneyscan. John Knoll showed the program to executives at both Apple and Adobe, but it was Adobe who purchased a license to distribute in September 1988. Photoshop 1.0 was released in February 1990 for Macintosh computers.
