Thanks again to **Jeffri Moore** who spoke on **Cellphone Photography** at the September meeting. Ans has the hand-out of notes for tips and advice on improving cell photography. It's far more versatile than Selfies. There is, however, a ratio in camera settings or preferences that affect the usefulness to technically exhibit photos. Ratio should be set to FUL or 3:4. A ratio of 16:9 (very narrow) basically eliminates pix for slideshows or videos. ReSET RATIO & RULE PHOTOWORLD.

The presentation at the **October meeting** was a bit more than unusual. The guest speaker, **Christina Katsolis** the lead museum technician, couldn't come because of severe understaffing at the Museum BUT the talented CCC Board jumped in and saved the day. There was quite a bit of input and insight on how to curate for exhibits. **Speaking of Exhibits** – CCC has been invited to exhibit in the Southeast Museum of Photography with the theme of **Still Life**. The Board asks members to **enter 10 images at 300ppi**. These can be current or harvested from 5 years ago. There were 2 Still Life Challenges during that period so finding your ideal image may be easier than anticipated. Entry fee is required but amount is unannounced at this point.

This invitation to exhibit at one of the South's finest galleries is a major honor and recognition for CCC. Every member needs to participate and proudly show the best of their work.
